Understanding the World	Children are offered a range of experiences and interactions to help them develop their sense of self, place and time. Resources offered to the children in their environment reflect experiences in the local and wider community. Sharing texts including non-fiction, story books, rhymes and poems provide further opportunities for children to develop their language and vocabulary with an understanding of the world around them.

Role play resources included a variety of materials, fabrics, dressing up costumes, fastenings and accessories for children to be creative. A range of books are included in each role play area to support and provide opportunities for children to act out stories and rhymes and develop their vocabulary and extend their language. The environment includes music making opportunities for children to independently and spontaneously create and explore music. Children have the opportunity to perform to a wider audiences throughout the year e.g. Harvest, Nativity and May Fayre. Art and design opportunities focus on the experience rather than a defined outcome where the children's responses will reflect their unique imaginations and creativity. They will have opportunities to view and respond to different art work and artists. In the environment, children will be provided with a range of open ended resources where they can choose what they use to create with. Adults will sumport children by talking about the skills and processes by using descriptive language.
