After this he took a whole school assembly and talked about his experiences as a member of parliament and spoke about democracy. The children were then able to ask lots of questions which Mr Sunak duly answered. This was a truly wonderful experience for our pupils who were a credit to our school. It was a pleasure for me to observe the children in conversation with the Prime Minister – they were polite, charming and engaged throughout. Some of their questions during the assembly were absolutely brilliant. As you can imagine, I am incredibly proud of our pupils and our school community. The children are very fortunate to have met the Prime Minister and I am sure you will enjoy talking to them about their experience over the weekend.

Five to Twelve study

Year 1 pupils from our school have been selected to take part in the new Five to Twelve study!

Five to Twelve is a new national study involving around 8,000 children attending primary school in the 2020s and their families. The study will explore how children are getting on in a range of areas in the post-pandemic context. By following children and their families over time, the study aims to provide a contemporary understanding of how children's environments and experiences impact on their future education and wellbeing outcomes.

For the first stage of the study, the National Centre for Social Research (NatCen), which is delivering the study on behalf of DfE, will have sent letters to the parents or carers of the selected children at their home address in October 2023. The information posted to families will list the various ways they can get in touch with the study team, should they have questions about participating or opting out.
