I am sure you have all read the article in the Northern Echo (see the link above). We are delighted to be taking part in the Defenders of Health project, which celebrates and raises awareness of global health. On Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> November, Brad Gudger, one of our former pupils and Mrs Gudger's son, helped to launch the project by leading a session with children in Class 2 and Class 3 on Microsoft Teams. Diagnosed with leukaemia when he was 19, Brad went on to receive The Diana Award for his work with young people and the cancer community. As well as founding his own charity, Alike, to combat loneliness and isolation among young people with cancer, he also acts as a youth advisor to the NHS, World Health Organisation and most recently the UN. Brad was simply inspirational and left a lasting impression on our young people, who are now really enthused and excited about the project.
